Hort Report

Hello to all you gardeners!! This is a busy time of year in the garden. There is planting to do, cleanup to be done, and readiness for wetter, cooler, colder weather to come. So let's get started!

And now....

In the veggie gardens: It is not too late to plant winter/spring vegetables. Keep in mind that while the days and nights are becoming cooler, the soil remains warm and that is what seeds need to germinate. So the window to plant is still open but will be closing soon. Before planting, amend your soil with compost to aid growth of your future salad bar ingredients! You can plant fava beans, beets, bok choy, swiss chard, collards, endive, garlic, shallots, leaf lettuce, radishes, spinach and peas through the month of October and beets, carrots, turnips and leeks until mid-October.

In the ornamental/flower gardens: Now is the time to divide and replant overgrown perennials such as iris, yarrow, and buckwheats. It is still ok to plant spring blooming bulbs but that window will be closing soon as well. Hold off on any pruning of ornamental trees, shrubs or perennials now as pruning would encourage new growth which would be susceptible to frost and freeze damage. Wait to prune until winter dormancy or after last frost next spring. Keep in mind that many perennial plants have some built in frost protection that is provided by the left over stems and stalks that turn brown and die after the first frost/freeze. Leaving these stems and stalks (even though it may look scraggly) shields the new growth in the

spring. Also, many beneficial insects over winter in the dead growth and remerge in the spring. It may not look beautiful, but brown, dried up foliage serves a purpose! Yay!!...mother nature at work!

And very shortly, frosty mornings will be upon us. It is important to know your historical first fall frost and last spring frost dates for your area so that you can act accordingly for planting times and for protecting your sensitive plants from damage. Here are some dates for a few local areas:

	<u>First fall frost</u>	<u>Last Spring frost</u>
Angels Camp	December 4	March 7
Arnold	October 18	May 18
Murphys	December 4	March 7
San Andreas	December 9	February 8
Sonora	November 1	April 18
